

Gève Plateau

Average length : 1 h 30 • Distance : 2,350 km • Variation : 26 m

Drive up to the Gève carpark. (5 km from the village). From there, walk along the small road towards the refuge. At the refuge, go straight ahead towards « la Patte d'oie ». Before the following intersection, take on your right and follow « le Chargeoir ». Once you are at the « Chargeoir » sign, walk to the crossroads called « les Chaumes » (about 150 m) and then walk to the direction « Combe Crause » (1,1 km). There, walk up on your right following the direction « parking de Gève », you'll walk about 400 m before getting back to the starting point.



Worth seeing : the Nordic ski Stadium has been one of the most important place for Nordic skiing since 1968 (biathlon trainings during the 1968's Olympics.)

A little hunger ? Gève's refuge, opened every day during the season : 04 76 95 33 89.

La Molière

Average length : 1 h 30 • Distance : 5 km • Variation : 75 m



From the Croix-Perrin pass (road to Lans-en-Vercors), drive along the forest track all the way up to the parking de la Molière (about 13 km). From there, walk up the direction « col de la Croix-Perrin », walk through the Tracollet pass, following the GTV walking track (yellow and green marks). Once you are at Charande (alt. 1709 m), one of the most beautiful viewpoint on Autrans, walk on to the « Pas de l'Ours » (Bear's pass). At this pass, walk down to the « refuge de la Molière ». For the way back, follow the direction « la Molière », you will then walk back to the car park, through the high pastures of la Molière, where hundreds of cows graze every summer.

Worth seeing : la Molière's plateau is one of the most remarkable viewpoints on the Belledonnes range, the Mont-Blanc, the Chartreuse massif and the Gresivaudan valley (Grenoble).

Around the village

Average length : 1 h 30 • Distance : 3,8 km • Variation : 80 m



From the tourist office, follow the pass that goes through the tennis courts. Once at the Gym, follow the Park's green and yellow marks (« Grand pré / grotte de la Ture »). Go through the AFRAT centre. At the crossroad behind the AFRAT, go straight ahead (« le Grand pré »).

At the crossroad named « le Grand pré », take on your right, still following the yellow and green marks (« route de Nave »). The path is lined with stones, « le Petit bois » is on your right hand side, it is a small pine forest. You are now at the post named « route de Nave, alt. 1067 m ». Follow on your left the tar road up to the « Banc de l'ours », a nice little Inn which stands upon the valley.

Option : if you want to make a shorter walk, you can go back to the village by going on your right at this point, towards the Gym (5 min.)

Otherwise, follow the tar road on your left up to the point « le Chatelard », then turn on your right to the Inn « le Banc de l'ours ». Follow the path that goes along the Inn down to the point « le Creusot ». Then, take on your right; you will directly go back to the Gym (yellow and green marks, 2 min. walk).

Worth seeing : the Andrevières Manor house (nowadays AFRAT centre), a castle Clod, reminiscence of the first inhabitants of the Vercors, 50 m above the Gym.

A little hunger ? Go and have a bite at the « Banc de l'Ours » Inn : 06 81 61 73 45. Open everyday at lunch time during the high season, booking recommended for the evenings.

Claret's wood

Average length : 1 h 45 • Distance : 5,7 km • Variation : 160 m



Follow the main street up to the main round about. From there, follow the road as if you were going to Lans-en-Vercors (straight ahead). On your right hand side, the Alpine ski slopes of le Claret and the Olympic ski jumps.

Pass along the tar road which goes up to the ski jumps and take the walking path which is 10 meters further on your right following the direction « les 3 chemins ». You pass the statue « Notre-Dame des neiges », and go up the path which goes into the forest (on your right).

After a 100 m long ramp, you end up at the « 3 chemins » point, 1160 m.

Option 1 : to go to the ski jumps viewpoint, follow the path on your right (about 5 m walk, return by the same way.) From the point « les 3 chemins », go straight ahead in the direction of « les Alliés ». 15 metres away, follow the yellow and green that goes on the left. Walk to the point « les Alliés » 1101 m (about 25 min.) Then take the path on the right to the point « la Ferme Julien ». 20 metres away, there is a crossroad : go straight ahead, still following the yellow and green path. Once you're out of the woods, you will find the point « la Ferme Julien ». At this stage, take the path on your right which will take you back to the village (about 30 min walk).

Option 2 : if you wish to go directly up the ski jumps, take the path at the bottom of the tar road that goes up the jumps ; caution, steep terrain !!!



Worth seeing : the 1968 Olympics ski jumps, from the top of which you can spot the former Olympic village. The Olympic flame is still on the car park next to the post office.



The Autrans/Méaudre valley

Average length : 2 h • Distance : 5,2 km • Variation : 40 m



Go down the street along the tourist office to the stop sign.

Turn on your right and follow that road straight ahead, through the hamlet of Andrevières.

You will go pass « Entre Chiens et Loups » a mushing center, and Déva, a flower elixir lab.



Keep on walking up to the next farm. Then, you will find a post on your left « les Vernes », follow that path which takes you through the grass fields and streams to the main road between Autrans and Méaudre.

Go across the road and follow it for 50 m on your right (please watch out for cars !) and then turn on your left to enter the hamlet of « les Vernes ». After the first farm, take the path on your left, and walk back to Autrans (about 35 min walk).

Worth seeing :

- Entre chiens et loups : mushing, cani-rando
- Laboratoire Déva : flower elixirs
